
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Below are a few things that need to be explained before starting this devotional

- This devotional has been designed to help children, aged predominantly between 7 and 12 years, to engage and learn from the book of Genesis. The goal is that it is completed with a trusted adult. If this is a helpful tool for adults as well, then enjoy!
- 2. The episodes have been divided into different parts.
 - » The 'Read Before' notes will provide context for the episode before reading the text.
 - » The 'Read After' notes will help provide understanding after reading the text.
 - » The Reflect section will ask students to think back on what happened in the episode.
 - » The Engage section will help students connect the episode to their own lives.
 - » The Standout section will help students note down the thing that stands out to them as they have read and engaged with the text.
 - The Pray section is broken down into 4 sections as follows: Wow - Praising God for something amazing about Him Thanks - Thanking God for something that He has done Please - Asking God for help with a situation, friendship, etc Sorry - Asking forgiveness for something that you have done
- 3. The book of Genesis has some mature themes. Some of those texts have been included in this devotional and some have been left out. Please choose your translation carefully and beware that these themes are discussed. Episodes that include mature themes have been marked with an asterisk (*). This is of particular importance if you choose to read all 50 chapters of Genesis.
- 4. There are no answers or teacher guide provided. Please prepare your own resources to enhance the ability of the student to engage with the stories. This may include watching YouTube videos that tell the Bible story, drama, games or other ideas. If this generates questions for you and your students (as I hope it does), please refer to wise biblical counsel to have your questions answered.
- 5. This devotional has been divided into 3 sections; Genesis 1-11, 12-36 and 37-50. Each section is concluded with a reflection page where children are invited to reflect on the whole section they have read. There is also a Kahoot quiz that has been made as part of the reflection process.



This devotional will take you on a journey from the creation of the world, through to God's people living in Egypt. Along the way, you'll meet the God who created the world and who passionately cares about His creation, and also the first humans who were involved in God's world.

Are humans going to join God in building His world? Or are they going to choose their own path and break what God is trying to build?

In Part 2, we are going to see God choose a man named Abram. He will bless not only him, but also his family. God will start building a family in which He can bless the whole world. Will Abram and his family choose to trust God and his plans? Or will they try to do it in their own strength and wisdom? Let's find out!









 After obeying God and leaving to follow Him, Abram ends up in Egypt (Genesis 12:10-20) because of a famine (which is fancy word for no food...and there was a drought). Abram becomes afraid because he thinks Pharaoh will kill him and take his beautiful wife, Sarai. Abram pretends that Sarai is his sister and doesn't tell Pharaoh she's his wife. Pharaoh gets sick and then Abram tells him the truth and he is kicked out of Egypt.



READ AFTER

- Abram lacks trust in God's plans when he heads down to Egypt. However, in this chapter, he trusts God. On one side (the side that Lot picked) the grass was green, there was plenty of water and things looked good. On the other side, things did not look as green and beautiful. Abram trusts God and gives Lot the choice. Lot picks the green side, but there is a problem, the people of Sodom were there and they were sinning against God (v. 13). These people become a problem for Lot and God, to the point where God destroys Sodom with fire.
- Abram trusts that it is God that will bless him wherever he goes, and that means that he doesn't need to always go first, have the best spot or get his way.



READ BEFORE

• In Genesis 14, Abram saves Lot. There are 5 kings (who have really crazy names) that go to war against 4 kings (also with crazy names). Lot is on the side with 4 kings. The 5 kings capture Sodom (the town Lot was living in), as well as Lot and his family. Abram hears about this, gets a band of soldiers together and goes and fights one of the 5 kings and gets Lot and all his possessions back. After receiving a blessing from the priest, the king of Sodom allows Abram to keep everything, except the people, but Abram refuses because he doesn't want the king to think he made him rich.

READ AFTER

- Abram could have been very scared because he just attacked a powerful king. God reminds him that he doesn't need to fear.
- Verse 6 is important because it is the first time Abram believed God. This was when he became righteous.
- God meets with Abram even though he has many questions and offers him reassurance. God does the same with us.
- The symbol of cutting 2 animals was like an agreement between 2 people. They didn't have lawyers back then, or paper or signatures. If 2 people wanted to make an agreement or promise, they would meet together, cut animals in half and walk between them (yes this is very different to today). This would also symbolise that death would be their fate if they broke their promise, just like the death of the animals.







• In Genesis 17, God comes again to Abram and reminds him of the covenant He has made with him. God calls Abram to walk before Him and be blameless, as Abram has not been doing this. God also changes Abram's name to Abraham which means "Father of many" and Sarai to Sarah. Abraham laughs at God and his promise because he is 99 years old.

• In this passage we see Jacob take 2 wives and he ends up having children with their 2 servants as well. If we go back to Genesis 2, God states that a man should be joined to his wife and the two would become one (Gen 2:18). God has designed marriage to be between 1 man and 1 woman. Despite there being examples of a man taking more than 1 wife in the Bible, it is not the way God has intended marriage, and this leads to bad results for Jacob and others that did this as well.



- In the rest of Genesis 29 to 30:24, things go from bad to worse for Jacob. God recognises that Leah isn't loved and gives her sons. She has **Reuben**, **Simeon**, **Levi** and **Judah** and names them all because she knows that she is unloved by her husband Jacob.
- Rachel gets jealous because she cannot have children so she decides to give her servant Bilhah to Jacob to have children. Bilhah has **Dan** and **Naphtali**.
- Then Leah gets jealous because of Rachel and Bilhah. So Leah gives her servant Zilpah to Jacob to have children. Zilpah has **Gad** and **Asher**.
- Then Leah does a deal with Rachel over some mandrakes (fruit) and has another son **Issachar** and then **Zebulun** as well. Some time later she also has a daughter named **Dinah**.
- Finally God opens Rachel's womb and she is able to have children and she has **Joseph** and **Benjamin** (Benjamin doesn't arrive until Genesis 35). This makes 12 sons for Jacob.




In Genesis 29 and 30 we see both jealousy and compassion. Both Jacob's wives are jealous of the other and do horrible things because of their jealousy. What is jealousy?

What things are you jealous of?

In spite of Leah and Rachel's jealousy, we see in these chapters God listening to both Leah and Rachel and showing compassion on them, even in their jealousy. God hears their prayers and enables them to have children. God takes a horrible situation, with a sinful family, and turns it to fulfill His plan to make Abraham's family into a great nation. These 12 sons become the 12 tribes of Israel (the 12 groups of people that make up the Israelite nation).

God does the same with us. God loves us even though we are broken and sinful. He forgives us and allows us to join Him in working to fulfill His plans and promises here on earth. To join Him God asks that we confess our sins, believe that Jesus is the true Saviour and trust Him in everything. Making this decision is the best decision you can ever make. If you would like to make this decision, talk to a trusted Christian adult about it and do it today $\underline{\Theta}$.







• If 11 sons wasn't enough, Jacob's flocks keep increasing and after some disagreement with Laban, Jacob ends up running away from him. Laban ends up blessing Jacob, and then Jacob takes his family back to his father. But he will have to meet Esau first. And the last time they met, Esau was ready to kill him!



READ AFTER

- In this passage, Jacob is very worried and afraid. Alone at night, God shows up and wrestles him. Through this wrestling match, we learn that following God requires perseverance. Jacob didn't give up wrestling until he got the blessing.
- We also see God change Jacob's identity. His name changes from Jacob (which means trickster) to Israel. Israel means someone who has struggled with God and man and overcome.
- Finally we see that Jacob's future is going to be determined by trusting God, not by his own strength. God dislocates Jacob's hip and he is no longer fit to fight Esau. He must trust God that He is going to watch out for him when he meets Esau.


